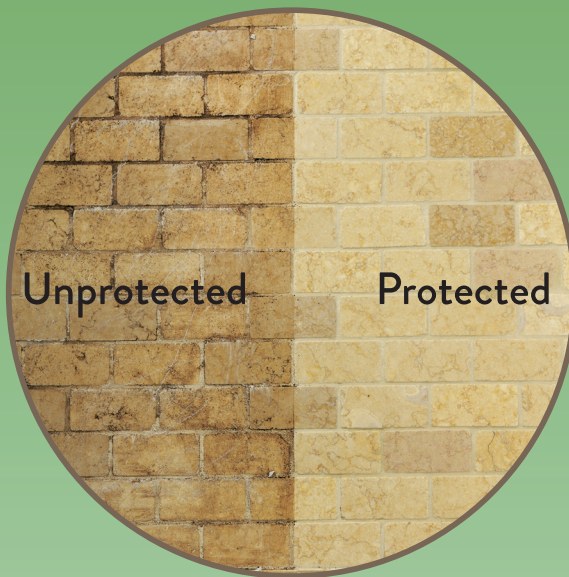

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Why Should I get my grout sealed?

A. The CTA (Ceramic Tile Association) states that to keep porous grout clean, a penetrating sealer should be applied.

Q. Why I shouldn't do it myself?

A. Some sealers are hazardous and can cause some grout to change color or even crack new grout.

Q. How will I benefit from sealing my grout?

A. It will make cleaning easy, resist stains and keep that beautiful, new look on kitchen and bath counters, showers, floors and any other tile or stone surface.

Q. Does the sealer protect against all spills?

A. With proper care the sealer will protect against most spills, but acidic liquid spills will etch stone surfaces. We recommend cleaning up spills with a damp towel or sponge as soon as possible.

Q. Will the sealer affect the grout color?

A. No, the sealer will not affect the sheen or color. The sealed area may appear dark for a few minutes but will lighten up to its original sheen and color when dry.

Q. What about a warranty?

A. All Stain Defenders grout-sealing services include a three-year, no "staining" warranty. We'll even provide you with a free grout care and maintenance sheet.

Q. How long will the sealer protect my grout surfaces?

A. Under normal use and proper care, this penetrating sealer will protect grout surfaces for 2 to 3 years. Once applied, the sealer crystallizes and fills up pores in the grout making the surface resistant to staining.

Q. When is the best time to seal my grout?

A. When the surface is new and not been used. When buying a new home, it's best to seal these surfaces before you move in.
